Solid Waste Collection

Containers

Stickers to help identify organics and recycling containers are available at the Village office. Please keep all (garbage, recycling, and organics) containers within these limits:

Maximum volume: 77 litres

Maximum weight: 22 kg

Organics and Yard Waste

Organics are collected from residences weekly. You can line your container with newspaper to help keep it clean.



You can include these products in your container:

- ✓ Food-soiled paper and cardboard, such as paper towels and pizza boxes
- ✓ Plate scrapings and leftovers
- ✓ Meats, poultry, fish and shellfish, cooked or uncooked. Bones too!
- ✓ Grains, pasta, dairy products, fruits and vegetables
- ✓ Coffee filters, grounds and tea bags
- ✓ Grass clippings, leaves, and plants
- ✓ Trimmings and branches less than 8cm diameter and no longer than 60cm

Please keep these items **out** of your organics container:

- ✗ All plastics, including biodegradable and compostable plastics and bags
- ✗ Metal, rubber, glass
- ✗ Coffee cups and lids
- ✗ Foam packaging and food trays
- ✗ Fruit stickers, bread clips and ties
- ✗ Diapers and baby wipes
- ✗ Animal carcasses, feces and kitty litter
- ✗ Dryer sheets and lint
- ✗ Vacuum contents and bags
- ✗ Cigarettes and cigarette butts
- ✗ Stumps, sod, soil, rocks and gravel
- ✗ Invasive plant species
- ✗ Construction materials and lumber

Be Bear Aware

To avoid attracting bears to your solid waste, please store your containers in an animal proof location until collection day and set out your containers on collection day by 8:00 am and not the night before.

Recycling

You can find a detailed list of what can be included in your curbside recycling container at recyclebc.ca or by searching “recycling” at cumberland.ca.

All recycling must be in a proper container, not in a plastic bag or cardboard box.

Foam packaging, plastic bags and outer wrap, and glass containers must be taken to the Comox Waste Management Centre or another depot for recycling.

Garbage – One Container

Bi-weekly collection of household items that cannot go in organics, yard waste, or recycling.

An additional two bags can be added by purchasing tags from the Village Office for \$2.00 each.

Please do not include these materials in your garbage container:

- ✗ Organics and yard waste
- ✗ Recyclables, including tin, plastics, cardboard, and refundable containers
- ✗ Household hazardous waste
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Ignitable waste and ashes
- ✗ Demolition and construction waste
- ✗ Oversized items of any kind, larger than 60cm
- ✗ Biomedical or pathological waste
- ✗ Animal carcasses
- ✗ Raw sewage or septic tank sludge

Household Hazardous Waste

Leftover products from your home that you consider to be dangerous can be dropped off at the Comox Valley Waste Management Centre.

This includes products like poisons, cleaners, paint products, oils, batteries, and chemicals.
