



Solid Waste Collection

Containers

Please make sure all solid waste containers have lids to keep out the rain and wildlife. Keep all containers within these limits:

Maximum volume: 77 liters / Maximum weight: 22 kg

Container stickers to help identify organics and recycling containers are available at the Village office.



Organics and Yard Waste

Organics are collected from residences weekly. You can line your container with newspaper to help keep it clean. Find out what you can place into the organics and yard waste at cumberland.ca

Garbage – One Container

Bi-weekly collection of household items that cannot go in organics, yard waste, or recycling. An additional two bags can be added by purchasing tags from the Village Office for \$2.00 each.

Be Bear Aware

To avoid attracting wildlife to your solid waste, store your containers in an animal proof location until collection day. Set out your containers on collection day by 8:00 am and not the night before.

Newspaper and flyers, magazines, office paper and cardboard

Containers

Aluminum cans, plastic jugs, frozen dessert containers, milk/cream containers and plastic jars and lids

Other

Aluminum foil, aerosol cans (empty), plastic cutlery and plastic straws



Take it to the Depot!

Glass

Non-deposit bottles and jars

Hazardous Materials

Items containing motor oil, antifreeze, gasoline and paint

Other

Styrofoam packaging and meat trays, film plastic, plastic plant pots and scrap metal

Please ensure that all recycling is clean.
