The position performs a combination of technical fieldwork and office duties related to infrastructure maintenance, capital projects, land development, and utility coordination. The role requires sound knowledge of civil engineering principles as applied to municipal construction and operations.

- Prepares cost estimates and assists with capital planning and maintenance budgeting.
- Assists with the preparation of tender documents and requests for proposals.

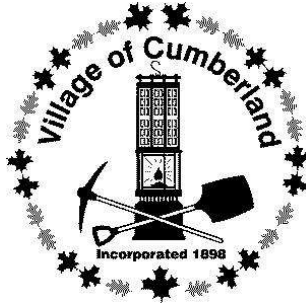

POSITION SUMMARY

Reporting to the Manager of Municipal Projects, the Engineering Technologist is part of a flexible team which oversees engineering construction and/or public works maintenance and assists with planning and development within the municipality. This position is required to perform a combination of office and field work pertaining to maintenance, extensions and rehabilitation of municipal infrastructure, and land development-related construction and capital projects. This is a position that requires technical knowledge of Civil Engineering that applies to municipal construction and operations

TYPICAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Collects technical field data, compiles as built data and service cards, and assists with preparation of engineering drawings and perform field surveys for municipal projects;
- Performs field inspections to ensure compliance with municipal regulations and bylaws;
- Reviews and makes recommendations and comments on applications for subdivision and development;
- Review engineered construction drawings and assist in reviewing subdivision and development applications to ensure compliance with applicable bylaws;
- Review approved engineering design related to land development and utility coordination;
- Review and processing of applications and permits for street and utility related infrastructure;
- Performs field inspections as required by the supervisor, commencing from installation to end of warranty periods for both new development and capital projects;

- Process permits under appropriate Bylaws;
- Coordinate with government agencies, developers, contractors, and consultants regarding existing and future works;
- Liaise with internal and external contacts such as staff, professional engineers, consultants, contractors, attend related meetings and maintain meeting notes/records;
- Produce cost estimates and assist with preparation of annual capital and maintenance budget;
- Prepare request for proposals or tenders for projects;
- Assist in preparation of Bylaws as required;
- Maintain work logs and records;
- Inspect public works construction for bylaw compliance and adherence to specifications;
- Investigates complaints from businesses, residents and the public and report to the superior of actions taken;
- Performs other related duties as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Excellent verbal and written communications skills including strong public relation skills in dealing with other government agencies, developers, residents and the general public;
- Ability to establish and maintain the effective working relationships with staff, consultants and contractors; Ability to coordinate, provide instruction and oversee the work of contractors and less experienced personnel;
